

3D Modeling in SketchUp Industry Roundtable: Friday, March 17, 2017



As BIM continues to converge the design and construction industries, it becomes necessary to understand the fundamentals of 3D modeling. SketchUp (www.SketchUp.com) is a free program that provides basic modeling functionality with an easy-to-learn interface, making it perfect for generating quick sketches and simple 3D models that can be used to graphically communicate ideas.

This seminar targets the beginning to intermediate user of SketchUp. Using examples of brick and concrete masonry, the seminar will guide participants on the basic commands of the program, showing how to build accurately-scaled 3D models that may simple enough to communicate quick concepts, or complex enough for shop drawings. The seminar also covers the basics of SketchUp's companion program, Layout, to generate scaled, annotated views of wall sections and masonry details. The program will also introduce participants to online resources for downloading and editing pre-constructed masonry SketchUp models developed by IMI.
